

- Chose CHE-WA as our host organization







# Concern: Overuse of disinfectants in school classroom routines

#### She asked:

How can we encourage safer alternatives for teachers who choose to clean in the classroom?



#### **Answer: Collaboration.** Leveraging CHE-WA resources

- » Created Cleaning for Health in the Classroom outreach
  - Presentation
  - Teacher's guide
  - Classroom cleaning kits
- » Funding and expertise from CHE partners
- » Utilizing nurse advocates
- » Trained 65 Seattle School District nurses
- » Outreach at 6 elementary schools



#### Model for Students

#### **Cleaning for Health Lessons**

- Teach how basic cleaning really works to remove dirt and most germs.
- Why fragrance-free matters:
  - cleaning products can impact the air we breathe
  - clean doesn't have a "lemon fresh" smell
- Importance of handwashing with plain soap and water.

## **Positive Feedback**

From teachers and nurses:

"We have now made our school a fragrance-free environment due to the information we received that day."



"We were given training AND MOST IMPORTANTLY supplies to make the change happen."

"It would be wonderful to see these cleaning changes made in all SPS!"

### **Other Results**

- The Seattle School District endorsed the *Cleaning for Health* guidelines; distributed to all principals.
- Seattle School District risk managers attended a CHE-WA meeting.
- WA Dept. of Health placed the *Cleaning for Health* guidelines on its website.
